

- Always check the tides before crossing Breydon, there is nowhere to stop if the water is too high for your boat to get under the bridge.
- Look at the map for Breydon before crossing.
- Never try to go outside of the markers, this water is very shallow.
- Never try to go on the inside of the yellow marker.
- Be aware that there is no speed restriction across Breydon, so speed boats do operate here and high wash from these boats can be expected.
- Get your windscreens lowered
- Ensure no one is on deck
- Get your lifejackets on
- If you have two helm positions use the lower one



Once you have committed to going through the bridges there is nowhere to stop, so always check the tides before setting off. If moored at Yarmouth, you can see the bridges or wait for slack tide. If you are the other side of Breydon water, check the tide tables, as you will not be able to stop if you cant get through and will have to turn back.

The tide can run very quickly through Yarmouth and over Breydon Water. Extra care must be taken when mooring up. Try to moor up against the tide.

If it is windy the water on Breydon can become very rough and it is common to have small waves breaking, extra care must be taken if you have to walk around the deck in these conditions.
